#### DISCUSSION ITEMS:

- Approval of February SAC minutes with spelling correction for “Lindsey” Legg. Motion by Jennifer Perez-Wolfkeil, second by Carol Bernich.
- **SAC Discretionary Funding**
  - o Dr. Hale discussed using SAC funds on paper for teachers or other supplies. Mrs. Wolfkeil added that paper is always very appreciated by teachers.
  - o Dr. Hale said the administration has shopped around for the best prices on supplies and equipment to save money. He praised Mr. Jannazo for reviewing the copy machine contract and saving money by using a copier for teacher printing.
  - o A motion was made to use the discretionary funds for generic supplies, including paper, dry erase markers, etc. Motion by Siner and second by Kline. Motion passed.
- Chairwoman Bethea discussed Teacher Appreciation week in May and Teacher Appreciation Day (May 7). She acknowledged that there is intensive testing that week and offered an alternate date, but it was realized that there would be fewer teachers participate, especially on a teacher work day.
  - o After spring break, we will have a meeting for Teacher Appreciation. Please check emails. SAC will need contributions from community and parents to support it.

- Jannazo
  - o Registration update: registration was completed successfully and went smoothly. The registration data helps with putting together the starting pieces of next year, including staffing and master schedule.
  - o IB numbers: fluctuate every year. Spending extra time marketing in a positive light when going to middle schools. We are emphasizing the benefits, not just credits, but preparation compared to others. Universities look very favorably at IB graduates.
- Katie White – May 8th will be a busy day. Choctaw is offering the AICE General Paper exam, like AP/IB exam for college credit. We have all of our 10th grade English II honors and pre-IB taking exam and regular English III juniors taking it. The exam has a really high pass rate, which is another opportunity for college credit.
  - o It will be a 4 p.m. after school exam. We will offer at Choctaw, set up in classrooms. Guidance and admin are reaching out to current and retired teachers willing to volunteer time to give the test to all 412 students. There will be 20 students to a room. 42 of the students will receive extra time, in separate rooms. 20-25 classrooms at Choctaw will be needed.
  - o Volunteers are needed for AP exams. May 7-18.
- Hale added that students just finished the first round of state testing. There were a few invalidations from cell phones. He praised teachers for their hard work in the classrooms, especially without support at home for some students. He stressed the importance of attendance, as well.
  - o Tribe Life – 8th grade open house – April 5th – 6-7:30 p.m. (welcoming new Indians to Indian territory)
  - o Video “Spirit of this place,” shown to spotlight clubs, extracurricular, etc. Going to project on the wall, giving us a new layout at the open house.
  - o Accolades: We are starting spring sports. Winter sports were very successful. Flag football won in a shut-out. Soccer teams made playoffs. Wrestling did well and both basketball teams finished at state runner up. Coach Dawn Brown coach of year. Chorus: superiors. Band: Superiors. Indianettes were recognized at city council.
  - o Nancy Kline: Clubs and groups can go to DoughLish – Edible Cooke Dough Shop on Racetrack Road for fundraisers. They will donate \$1 per scoop.
