### Did You Know?


### Are all families that share housing considered homeless?

Young people who experience homelessness: No. Families that share housing, living in a variety of health care settings, must still meet the McKinney-Vento definition's requirement that the living situation is due to a loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason. Families that live together due to cultural preference, to save money, or to pool resources to provide a larger/nicer home than would be possible if living individually should not be considered homeless.

- 5.23 times more likely to be victims of dating violence
- 5.03 times more likely to be victims of physical dating violence
- 5.88 times more likely to be victims of physical dating violence
- 4.63 times more likely to misuse pain medication
- 3.21 times more likely to make a suicide attempt
- 7.19 times more likely to attempt suicide
