Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA) – Class of 2023

The *2022-2023 Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA)* will be available online beginning **October 1, 2022**. The Office of Student Financial Assistance (OSFA) website at www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org provides the FFAA to students seeking state scholarship and grant awards (including Bright Futures) for the 2021-2022 postsecondary academic year.

Applications can be made beginning **October 1, 2022**, for seniors in the Class of 2023 at www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org.

**OSFA will evaluate students based on official ACT® and SAT® test scores obtained directly from the two national test companies through the state test repository. In order for the scores to be sent to the repository, students must request their official test scores be sent to one of Florida's 12 state public universities when registering for the ACT®/SAT®. The demographic information between a student transcript and ACT®/SAT® registration must match exactly or the scores will not properly load into the student's evaluation.

Honors Graduation Criteria

Students must be on track for graduation with their cohort or before. The cumulative weighted GPA listed below delineates the selection of honor graduates. Includes, high school courses, middle school courses that count for high school credit, dual enrollment and virtual/online courses. Calculations will be made at the conclusion of the 7th semester.

Summa Cum Laude – 4.25 and above

Magna Cum Laude – 4.0-4.24

Cum Laude – 3.75-3.99
